

Countertop measuring guide

Take photos of the existing space

A picture is worth a thousand words. Providing photos of your entire existing space, along with your floor plan, is extremely helpful in communicating to our design team your existing layout and what you plan to change. Include as many angles that you can, including windows, ceiling and openings to adjoining rooms.

Measuring your existing countertops

Begin by measuring the existing countertops wall-to-wall, corner to corner. Again, make sure to record all measurements in inches.

- 1. Measure the length of all countertop
- 2. Measure depth (width) of all countertops
- 3. Indicate where the sink and other appliances land
- 4. Indicate finished edges Metropolitan uses this symbol: //

Important information about your existing countertops

- 1. What is the material of your existing countertop?
- 2. What is the thickness of your existing countertops?
- 3. Do you have tile backsplash?
- 4. Do you have back splash with the countertops?
- 5. Does your backsplash go all the way up to the upper cabinets?
